DYESS CHANGES APPRECIATION DAY VENUE; PARTNERS WITH ABILENE EAA FOR 2007 BIG COUNTRY AIRFEST

DYESS AIR FORCE BASE, Texas – Dyess officials have re-examined the date for this year's Big Country Appreciation Day and have decided to change the date and venue due to budget reductions, the multiple university graduations, Mother's Day weekend, and other local events happening May 12 that may affect attendance here.

However, Dyess has capitalized on the great relationship it shares with Abilene and Taylor County and has partnered with the Experimental Aircraft Association at Abilene Regional Airport to provide aerial and ground demonstrations for the 2007 Big Country AirFest on August 18. Beginning this year and continuing indefinitely, the new partnership will consist of the base and the AirFest alternating between locations and venues to provide a high-quality event for the community each year. Teaming with the EAA at the airport will also help Dyess and the Air Force save thousands of dollars.
