This could change by June of 2010. The change is tied to the CPI index so this will not be a big change.

Hanger #3 – We have a bid from Steve's Mobile Wash to steam clean and refinish the sides of hanger #3. This work will be completed sometime in the spring when we again have acceptable weather. For years, there has been talk about the meeting room for the back of Hanger #3. Money has been donated for a part of this expense. It is something that will need to be finished in 2010. The first priority will be to erect the framework for the walls and roof. Then we can complete our projected cost of finishing the room. I have tried to get the city to abate our rent for #3 like I did for the T-hangers. The local economy will not allow this. Therefore, this expense will come out of our own funds. May I suggest that we form a committee that can complete these plans and start this building program?

<u>Young Eagles</u> – We have all seen the dedicated work that Gary Potter has put into this very important function of EAA. This activity is of national importance to the EAA organization. Because of the work of **Gary Potter**, EAA Chapter 471 has done an outstanding job with this objective. We also want to thank all the pilots/owners who have donated their time – expense and planes to the objective. If you have never taken part in any of these events, please make every effort to be a part of this important event in 2010.
