

# Southwest Regional Fly-In Cancelled For 2008

Representatives of the Southwest Regional Fly-In, Inc., also known as the EAA Texas Fly-In voted to cancel the fly-in scheduled for October 10-11, 2008 and to ultimately cease operations. In addition to dwindling attendance numbers and difficulty in attracting volunteers for the annual event in Hondo, TX, in the end declining support from the Experimental Aircraft Association for the regional event spelled trouble for SWRFI... and may portend similar problems for other regional fly-ins. "EAA headquarters decided to cease branding regional flyins as EAA events," SWRFI officials said, "[and] EAA will no longer insure regional events. The board felt that losing the EAA brand would make it increasingly difficult to obtain sponsors, exhibitors, and volunteers."

# Mother, son solo on same day

Completing your first solo flight is a special memory. Especially if you solo on the same day as your mother, like Steve Poteet of Fort Worth, Texas, did. "It really is an awesome thing to share with her," said Steve, 43. He watched his 64-year-old mother Sylvia solo on Nov. 29 at Seymour Municipal in Seymour, Texas, where she resides. "Then we hugged, high fived, and I got in and did mine," he added. "We came to the realization about a month ago that we were at about the same place, skill-level wise, and it might be possible to solo at the same place on the same day," said Steve. Their flight instructor, John Coon, agreed they were both ready—Sylvia with 30 flight hours and Steve with 14. "At first I was really excited and keyed-up," said Sylvia, a nurse anesthetist. "But once I got ready I became quiet and focused. I wasn't nervous. Once I got through I felt a rush of excitement."

Airplanes have fascinated Sylvia since she was nine years old. For years, she dreamed of learning to fly but never had the opportunity. That is until her son partnered with a friend and purchased a Cessna 172. He brought Sylvia out to the airport to see his new toy, and she was hooked. She is now part owner of the airplane. "She sat down in the cockpit and was interested in everything about the airplane," said Steve, who works in church ministry. "I was surprised when I found out she had always wanted to fly."

Steve encouraged his mother to take lessons and coordinate their flying, even sharing an instructor. Often, Steve flies to Seymour with their instructor and lets Sylvia take a lesson before taking his own lesson and flying back to Fort Worth. They see each other about every two to three weeks. "It was special to see her pursue a lifelong passion," said Steve. "Taking her first solo flight was a major step toward that goal."

### President's Message

It's Wednesday afternoon after Christmas and I'm back in the office. I flew back to Abilene this morning from Pagosa Springs, Colorado (KPSO). It was the kind of flight that you hope for and enjoy. I had a tailwind of 25 knots and up to 35 knots at times. It's 466 nm and the flight time was 2:40. There was no turbulence and the sky was crystal clear. We flew at 13,500 feet, using the new 2-place oxygen system that I received as a Christmas present. At that altitude, we were able to fly direct KABI, right over the mountains at Taos, NM (you can see Taos airport in the foreground of the picture below). The autopilot (and the heater) worked perfectly, and I spent most of the time looking at the vastness of New Mexico and Texas. There was quite a bit of snow, too.



What made it special was that I flew in a plane that I had built (with a lot of help) over the last 10 years and recently gotten certified. I still have work to do on the plane, like installing the interior panels and finishing the gear fairings. I hope to have these items done before long, as my wife has a long list of places that we plan to visit next summer in the plane.

I've owned airplanes before. What this plane has done is to once again give me the ability, the freedom to expand my horizons to more distant places. I plan to use this ability as much as possible, and whenever able, I will share with the Chapter some of the highlights of flying an airplane that you built yourself
